WRITING COMMENTARY (OP-ED) QUALITIES

Ideas

the writing is *focused on an issue important to the writer* there is a combination of story and evidence woven together to make a point

Organization

a strong *lead* moves the argument forward, often this is short, cohesive story the *ideas* are developed in a logical way and the elements work together use of *transitional pbrases or subtitles* connect evidence strands to one another and to the central idea

the ending completes discussion of the central idea

VOICE

the voice is *appropriate* for the audience a confident, efficient voice holds the reader's attention and shows a command of the subject while also *conversational* in tone

WORD CHOICE

original, ear-catching phrases strong verbs, clear nouns, and fewer adverbs and adjectives meaning is illuminated by vivid, precise words
